

# No Excuse Scrapbooking

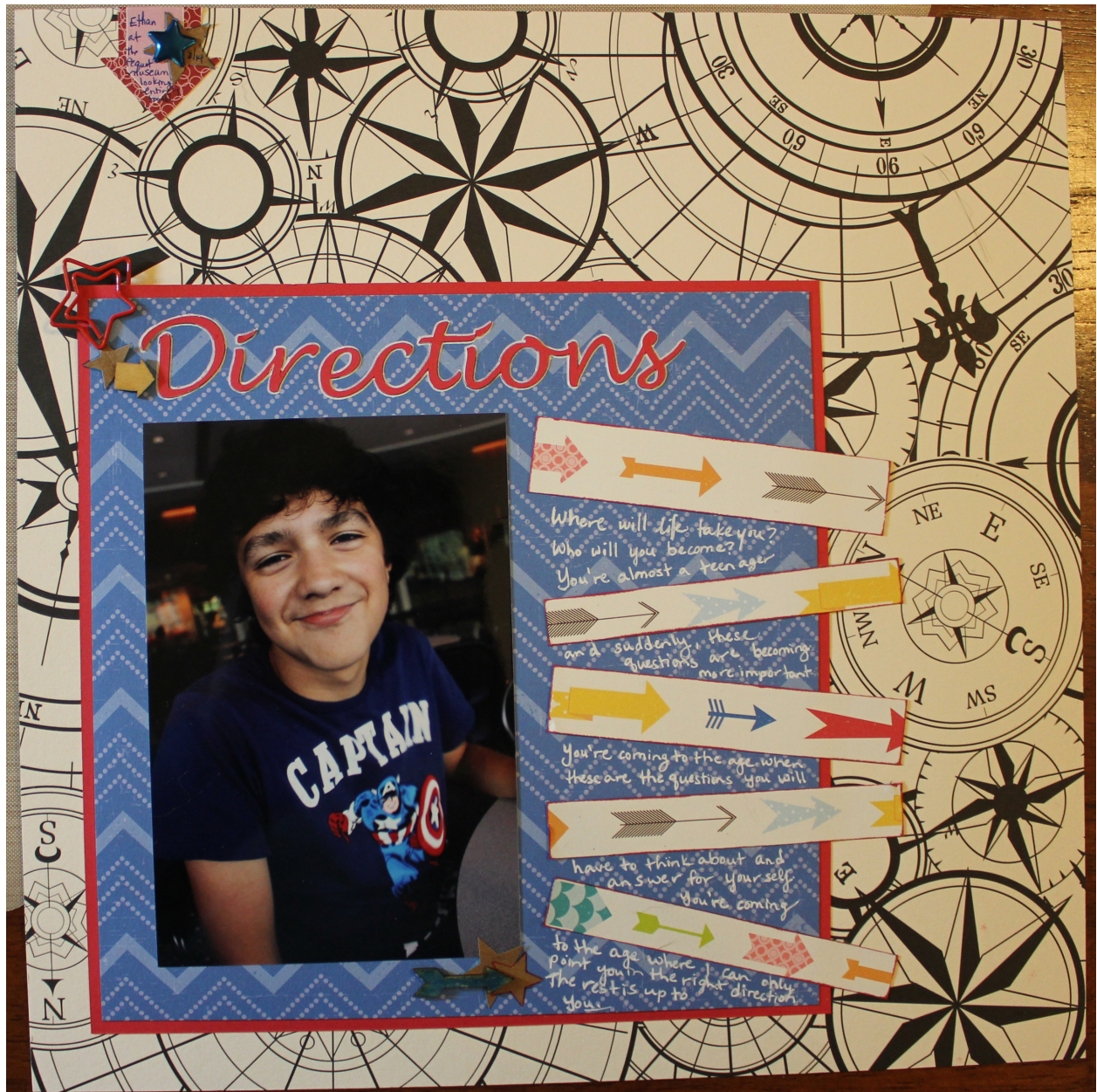
What's stopping you from starting?

## The Parts of a Page (Girl Power)

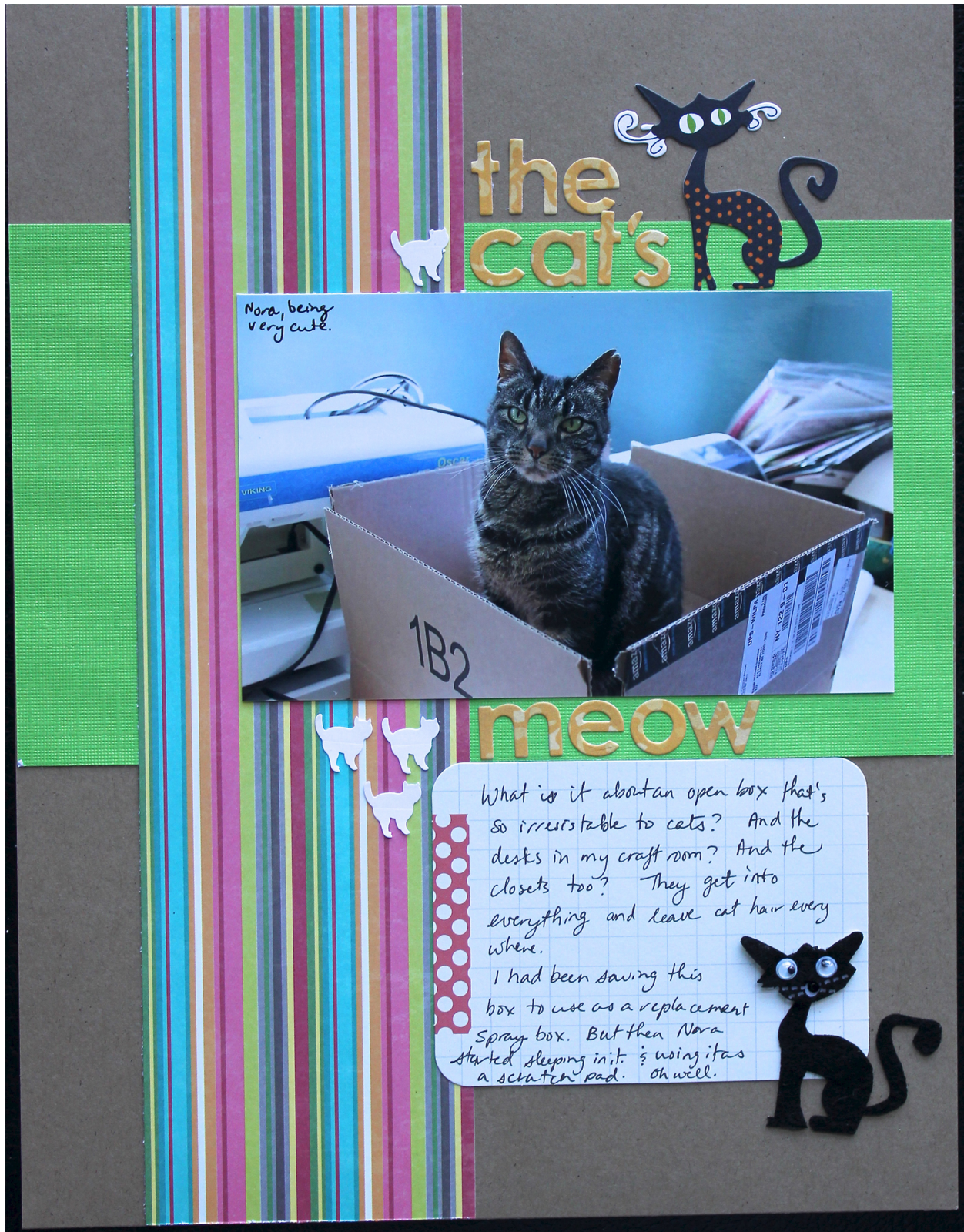


## Repetition (Directions)



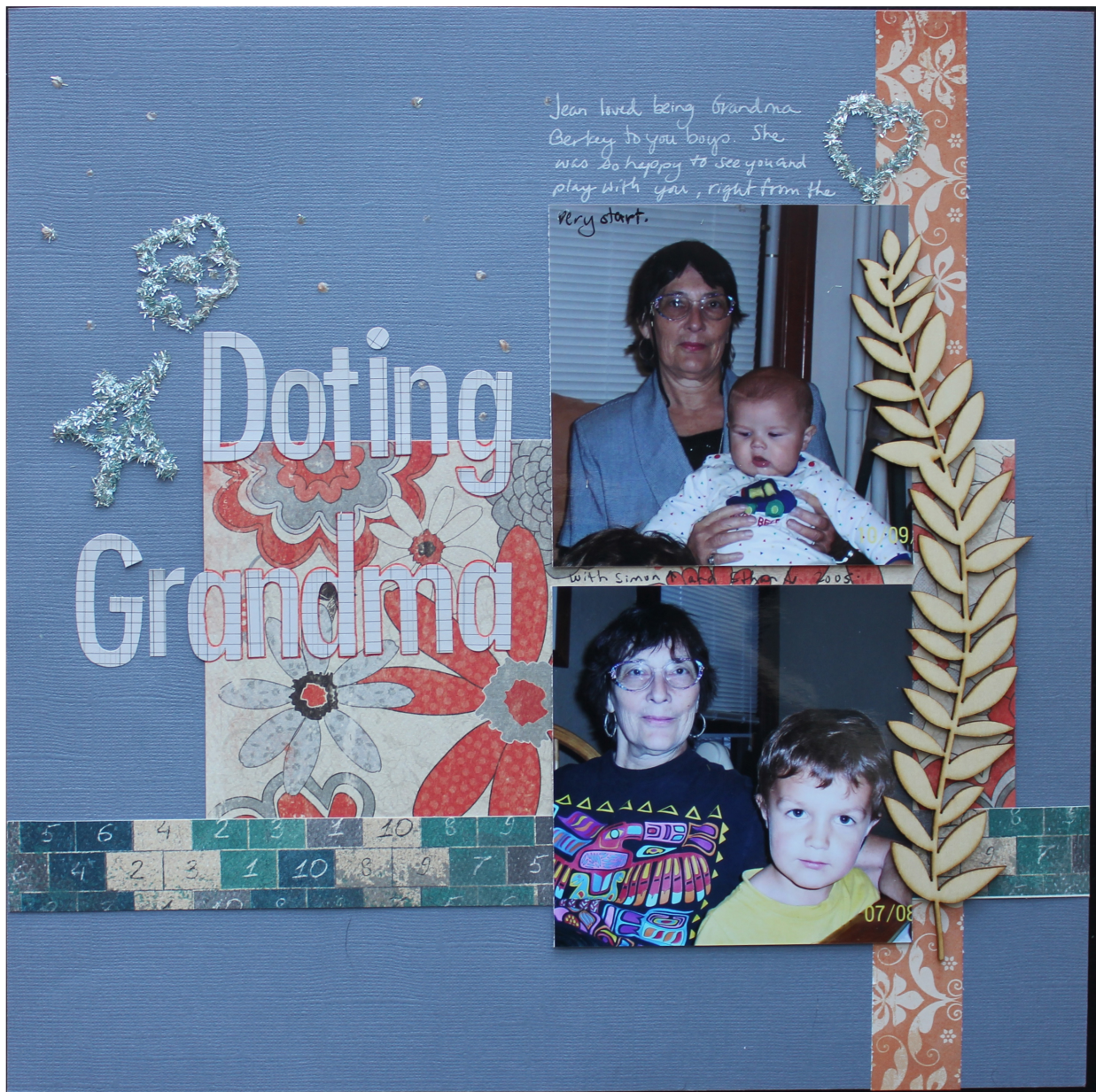
Repetition: Arrows and stars are repeated shapes throughout the page, as well as the colors of red and blue, from the photo to the patterned papers to the embellishments.

## Visual Triangle (The Cat's Meow)



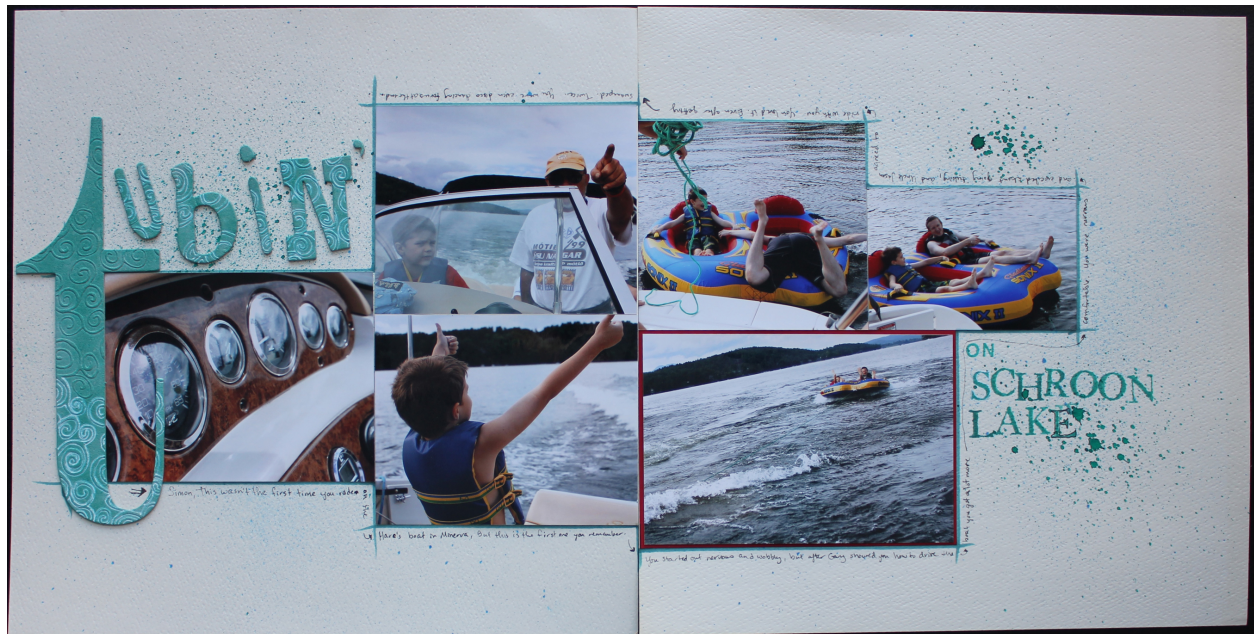
Visual Triangle: The cat embellishments create an imaginary triangle that moves your eye around the page.

## Rule of Thirds (Doting Grandma)



Rule of thirds: If you imagine a tic-tac-toe board drawn on this page, the two photos lie on the right hand intersections, making them obvious focal points.

## Contrast (Tubin' on Schroon Lake)



Contrast: The extra large "t" on the title uses size difference to create visual interest and excitement, while the thin red border around the bottom right photo uses color contrast to show you where the action on the layout is.

## Sketch interpretation (Growing Up)



**Sketch interpretation - adding a second layer of photos and flipping left to right.  
(Saranac Ice Castle)**



**Sketch interpretation – just right page, 2 horizontal photos vs. vertical photos, different matting style. (Girl Power)**
